

## Program Jump Start - Part #9 - Peak Award

The Peak Award represents the summit of the mountain.

- 1. I know I can check the Peak Award requirements for the section in Scouts | Terrain, the Section Record book and with the State Section Council.
- 2. I am familiar with the handy S2P converter to help when planning transition from the old Award Scheme to new Achievement Pathways.
- 3. We know that not all youth members will achieve the Peak Award and that is perfectly OK.
- 4. During the transition to Milestones, Scouts may progress to the Peak Award using a hybrid model of old and new program. These requirements have been defined by each State Section Council.
- 5. The Peak Award represents the summit of the mountain.

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Not all youth members are expected to achieve the Peak Award. The pathway to the Peak Award includes a number of personal challenges where the requirements vary between age Sections.



- Specific requirements are detailed in Scouts | Terrain, the Section Record Book and by the State Section Council.
- Utilize conversions from the old award scheme to the Achievement Pathways, check the converter <a href="here">here</a>.
- Complete Milestone 3 for your Section.
  - \* Youth members commencing more than 1/3<sup>rd</sup> through the section age range commence on Milestone 2 and those more than 2/3<sup>rd</sup> through commence on Milestone 3.
- Complete prescribed number of Outdoor Adventure Skills progressions for your Section in the core activities.
- Complete the prescribed number of Special Interest Area badges.
- Complete an Adventurous Journey.
- Complete a Leadership or Personal Development Course.
- Complete a personal reflection on the journey to the Peak Award.

Once earned, the Peak Award badges can stay on your uniform, but only if they are all from the new program badge range. This may require earlier Peak Award badges to be changed for the current badge.
