Role and Responsibilities

- Support quality young adult programs within the Rover Scout Motorsport Sub-Committee
- At all times encourage activities that support retention and recruitment of young adults.
- Promote and support motorsport activities within the Rover Section
- Provide and support a clear sense of direction, lead by example and demonstrate integrity
 when working with young adults. Operate in accordance with the code of conduct for
 Adults in Scouting.
- Be a mentor for all members of the Committee, especially relating to areas of personal development that can be progressed through formal training, the Rover Program and volunteering within the Rover management structure.
- Act on the requests and needs of the Committee in a timely manner.
- Assist in maintaining continuity and consistency in the Committee.
- Develop and maintain regular contact with other Rover Advisors and relevant Commissioners at Region and State level.
- While maintaining impartiality and a fair process, take a lead role in equipping young adults to manage difficult situations, work with others and resolve conflict.
- Be an active member of the Committee.
- Ensure that the Committee is aware of its moral, ethical and legal obligations and Scout policy.
- Develop an effective liaison with Motorsport Australia.

Qualifications and Training Requirements

- Have completed Rover Essentials training, or be willing to complete such training within 12 months.
- Have completed Rover Advanced training and the Woodbadge, or be willing to complete within three years.

 Strong written and oral communication skills. Basic computer skills and own internet access.

Preferred Skills

- Enthusiasm and a strong commitment to Scouting Principles and program
- Ability to motivate and communicate effectively with young adults. Ability to support others undertaking formal training
- A comprehensive understanding of the requirements of Rover Scout Motorsport and the obligations under Motorsport Australia

Indicative Commitments

- Attend committee meetings (the first Thursday of the month)
- Ad hoc meetings as required to deliver on the role and responsibilities documented above

Term of Appointment
